Dennis Grimm led Manning's 29 last half outburst with a 19 point total, Hans "Junior" Bonnesen followed with eight. Big Reds easy mark Tuesday

Manning cagers had a field night here Tuesday when Coach Don Buhr cleared the bench as the bulldogs racked up the Big Reds of Missouri Valley 67-34 in a non-conference affair.

The first period was past the half-way mark before Valley managed a free throw and by that time Manning had tallied 11 points with every cager registering.

Quarter end saw Coach Buhr's lads hold a 24-4 margin.

That was the tempo of the game. First stringers were used in only little more than half of the game, reserves playing nearly half of the second period and all of the final canto.

Second period saw Manning tally ten before Hoyle of Missouri Valley fielded on to make the score stand 38-6. Manning seconds did an adequate job defensively allowing only seven points to the visitors the rest of the half which ended 38-13. A 21-point splurge by Manning in the third together with four for Missouri Valley found the period ending 59-17. The Big Reds were able to double their 17-point three quarter total in the limit frame against Manning reserves, who registered eight to ring down the final curtain 67-34.
