Yes I was in the military. I served with the U. S. Marines during the Korean War. I was in from February 1952 until February of 1954 and served overseas, as well. I have the Korean Service metal and the National Defense ribbon. speaking of the Korean thing. I understand some while ago some congressman back there gave out some kind of Korean Service Pin for Iowan's. I contacted him and was told since I wasn't an Iowa residence anymore I couldn't get one and I checked here in Nevada on that and no one seems to know diddly. As for my schooling, yes I attended a one room country schoolhouse which located approximately one half mile from my rural farm home. My Teacher I had was Lorene Pfoltner Pfankuch. She passed away here recently I was informed. In my last year I had Edna Mae Dammann Rudnick.

I understand she is still living in the Phoenix, AZ area. When we graduated from 8th grade we took a battery of tests and then later received out diploma at the Crawford County seat there at Denison, IA. My class Graduation picture I guess got lost as it was left at home with my parents and in their moves around I guess it was lost. I don't recall just who handed out our 8th grade diplomas, may have been the county school superintendent who was a Mr. F. N. Olry. I think that is how his name was spelled. Then in the fall of 1945 I entered into Manning High. The 9th grade at that time was located in a separate building kind of in the center of town.
